Visitation is by reservation and availability only. Three reservation slots per each visitation time/day. Location of outdoors or indoors is to be determined at the time of the visit.

When arriving visitors are to call the medication aide cell phone to notify of your arrival.

You will then be directed to the area of "A, B, or C" of assigned visitation area.

Screening of symptoms is required before the visit begins.

Visitation areas are at the back patios, following the walking path.

Visitation area "B" and "C" is the second patio area
(between Jasmine and Periwinkle hallways)
