VISITATION

Welcome to our building. Please wear a mask throughout building and while visiting. **Masks must remain on at all times.** Please remain in residents room, outside or in a designated visiting area only. (No common area where other residents would congregate such as lunch rooms, TV rooms, or activities.) Please sanitize hands often. If you choose not to adhere to our rules you may be asked to leave for the safety of all of our residents.

NO SMOKING

For the safety of our residents, there is a strict **no smoking** policy. This includes in the building, on campus, in the parking lots, and in vehicles anywhere on the property. If you are caught smoking in any of these locations, you may be asked to leave.



VISITS AND PARTIES

Visits and small parties for special occasions are welcome. For the safety of all visitors, residents, and employees, we prefer visits and parties to be held outside. If anyone is planning a visit or party, please call the facility ahead of time at 814-849-3615.

NO LITTERING

We pride ourselves in keeping our facilities looking clean and beautiful. Please properly dispose of any garbage or masks in our provided trash bins.

COVID-19 REGULATIONS


Although our facilities are open for visitation, we are still following CDC guidelines to keep our residents safe and prevent the spread of the virus. We ask that you abide by the following guidelines when visiting our residents:

- Visitors who have a positive viral test for COVID-19, symptoms of COVID-19, or currently meet the criteria for quarantine, will not be permitted to visit the building. Visitors will be screened for COVID -19 prior to each visit. Symptoms include fever, cough, tiredness, sore throat, body aches, diarrhea, loss of taste or smell, and shortness of breath.
- Hand hygiene is required at the entry of the building. (Use of alcohol-based hand rub is preferred)
- Face covering or mask at all times (covering mouth and nose) and physical distancing at least six feet between people, in accordance with CDC guidance.
- Instructional signage and education throughout the facility must be followed.
- During indoor visitation, visitor movement is limited to resident designated visitation space only.
- Visitors must acknowledge that it is safer not to enter the facility during an outbreak, and the risk of exposure to COVID-19 transmission is present.

Purple Heart Day

Purple Heart Day is observed on Aug. 7 each year and is a time for Americans to remember and honor the brave men and women who were either wounded on the battlefield, or paid the ultimate sacrifice with their lives. Purple Heart Day is also known as National Purple Heart Day, Purple Heart Recognition Day and Purple Heart Appreciation Day.



In general it may be awarded to members of the Armed Forces of the United States who have been wounded, killed in action, or have died or may die from wounds received in any action against the United States, action with an opposing armed force, the results of any hostile "foreign force" and many other situations where men and women in uniform may find themselves under attack. The Purple Heart is now also given to persons who are injured, wounded or died while a prisoner of war.

Purple Heart Day will be observed on Sunday, Aug. 7, 2022.



Sunflower Trivia—Sunflowers display a behavior called heliotropism. The flower buds and young blossoms will face east in the morning and follow the sun as the earth moves during the day. However, as the flowers get heavier during seed production, the stems will stiffen and the mature flower heads will generally remain facing east.
